Goodbye, Antonello!

One year ago, the contemporary Italian art world lost one of its most promising and talented stars. Born in the southern Italian city of Taranto in 1960, Antonello Bulgini was at the height of a brilliant career creating vibrant and fantastical paintings at the time of his premature death in 2011. A new exhibit at the Pietro Canonica Museum in Villa Borghese is dedicated to the short but prolific career of this artist who succinctly captured the contradictions between the challenging times of the '80s and '90s.

Top Sights

CASTEL SANT'ANGELO - Emperor Hadrian's mausoleum, transformed into a fortress centuries later, remained such until the beginning of the 19th century. For the kids, there's also an ancient weapon section. Open Tues-Sun 9am-7pm, Giardini di Castello (Piazza Adriana). €5. Map C2

COLOSSEUM -Built in A.D. 72, the Flavian Amphitheater originally had a seating capacity of 50,000 and a sail-like roof covering. Piazza del Colosseo, Open daily, 9am-sunset (7:30pm in summer and 4:30pm in winter, ticket office closes 1 hour before closing). €12 incl. admission to Palatine and Forum. Map F4

PIAZZA NAVONA—One of the most beautiful spots in Rome, this lively square boasts three breathtaking fountains. The central and most famous one, the Fountain of the Four Rivers, was designed by Bernini and encompasses an Egyptian obelisk and an enormous Travertine sculpture of four river gods. Map D3

ROMAN FORUM —The heart of Ancient Rome. See Septimius Severus' Arch, the Temple of Castor and Pollux, the House of the Vestal Virgins, and more. Tel 066990110. €12 incl. admission to Colosseum. Map E/F4

SAINT PETER'S —The largest church in the world with works of art including Michelangelo's Pietà and Bernini's Baldacchino. No shorts, short skirts, or bare shoulders. Open 7am-6pm. Tel 0669881662. Map B3

SISTINE CHAPEL/VATICAN MUSEUMS — Egyptian, Etruscan, Roman, Renaissance and Baroque art, works by Michelangelo, Raphael, Caravaggio and Canova as well as the aweinspiring Sistine Chapel, Open Mon-Sat 9am-5:30pm, last entrance 4pm. €15, 8 reduced. Viale del Vaticano. Tel 0669883333. Entrance

SPANISH STEPS—The most famous staircase in the world is also a nightly meeting place for anyone out and about in Rome. Take a drink from the famous Barcaccia Fountain, climb the stairs for a fantastic view and visit the stunning Trinità dei Monti church at the top. Piazza di Spagna. Map E2

TREVI FOUNTAIN—Don't leave Rome without throwing a coin in the Trevi Fountain. It will ensure you a trip back to the Eternal City. The magestic late-baroque fountain designed by Nicola Salvi. Piazza di Trevi. Map E3

360° VIEW-The terrace atop the Vittoriano provides one of the best views in the city. The platform can be reached through two brandnew glass elevators, saving lazy legs the 196 steps leading to the terrace. The 35-second trip costs €7. Piazza Venezia. Map D4

ARA PACIS MUSEUM -The Augustean Altar to Peace is housed in Richard Meier's new Ara Pacis Museum, the first work of modern architecture in the Centro Storico since the Fascist Era, Open Tues-Sun 9am-7pm, Lungotevere in Augusta. Tel 0682059127. €11, 9 reduced. Map D2

CATACOMBS - Miles of underground tunnels contain the remains and the graves of martyrs, saints, and ordinary people, buried in the early Christian era. Via Appia Antica. €Prices vary. Off Map

CRYPTA BALBI—This recently discovered archeological site offers visitors the unique opportunity to study many different layers of Rome's history. The attached museum contains artifacts found on site and detailed explanations. Via delle Botteghe Oscure, 31. Open Tue-Sun, 9am-7pm. €7 (3.50 reduced). Map D/E4

OSTIA ANTICA —16 miles southwest of Rome, this remarkably well-preserved ancient city and gives an excellent picture of life under the Roman Empire. Viale dei Romagnoli, 717. Take metro B line, get off at Magliana, then take train to Ostia Antica. Tel. 0656358036. €6.50. Closed Monday Off Map

PALATINE HILL —Walk through the ancient city to get a feel of the Imperial days. The Palatine Forum includes the Domus Flavia, the Museo Palatino, the palace and baths of Septimius Severus. PANTHEON -The best preserved Roman monument, it was constructed by Agrippa in 27 B.C. and rebuilt by Hadrian in A.D. 117-125. In A.D. 608 it was transformed into a Christian church. It contains the tombs of Vittorio Emanuele and the great painter Raphael. Piazza della Rotonda. €Free. Map D3

TERME DI CARACALLA—This monumental bath complex was once the center of Roman civic, social and political life. Learn about the ancient techniques for heating water and imagine how it looked before it was unhappily stripped of its precious marbles and mosaics Via delle Terme di Caracalla, 52. TRAJAN'S MARKETS -The recently restored semicircular market was Ancient Rome's mall and an office building. The site also houses an archaeology museum, and occasional contemporary installations. Via IV Novembre, 94. Tel 066790048. Open daily, 9am-7pm. €11, 9 reduced. Map E4
